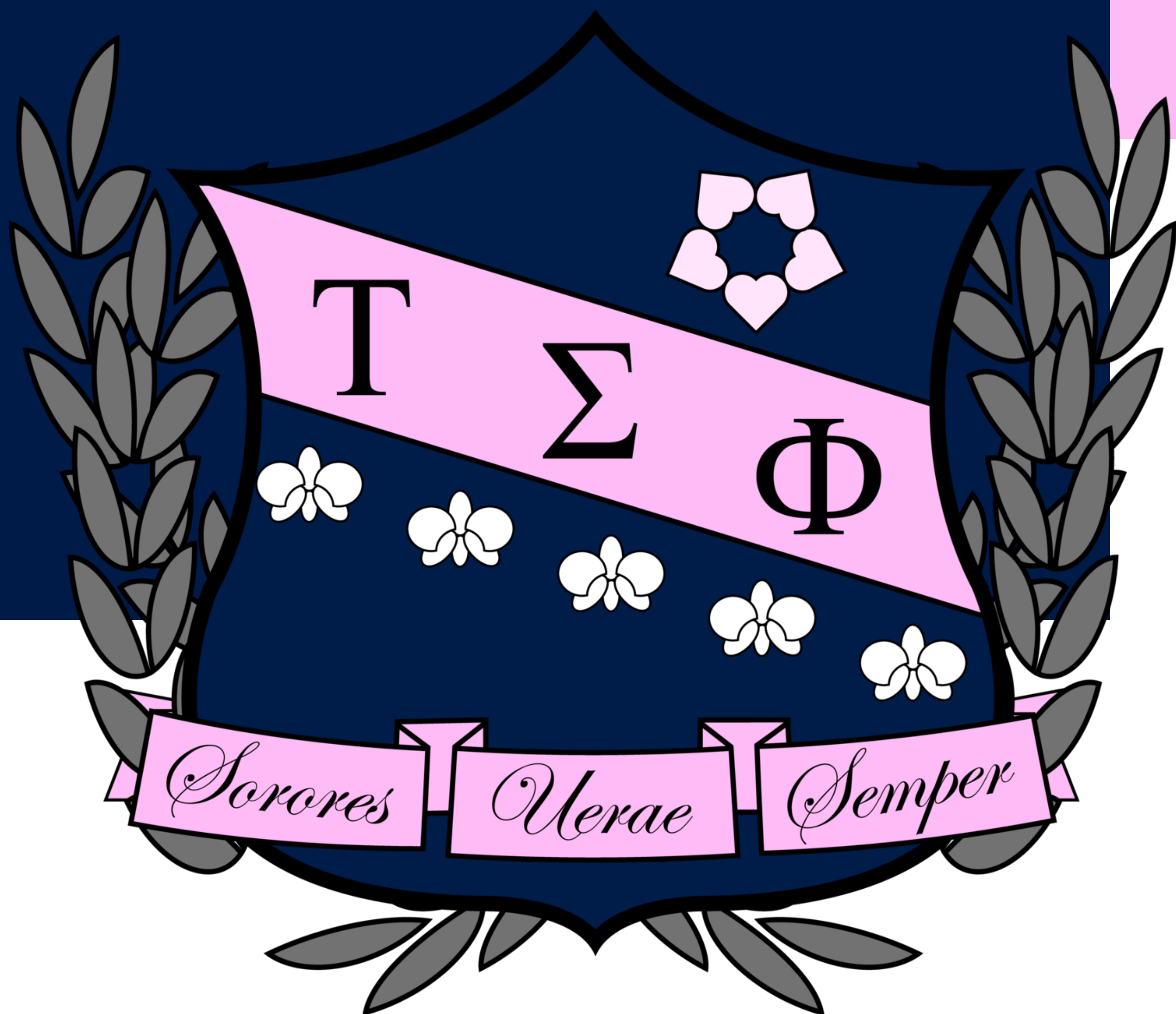


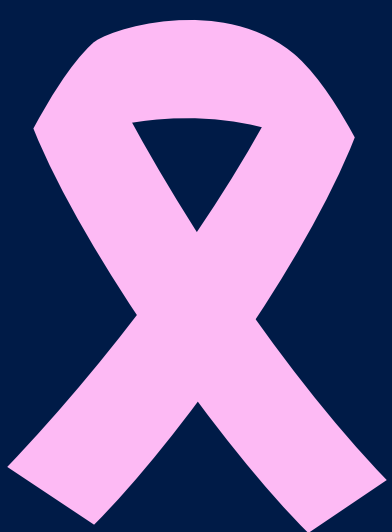

Sisterhood

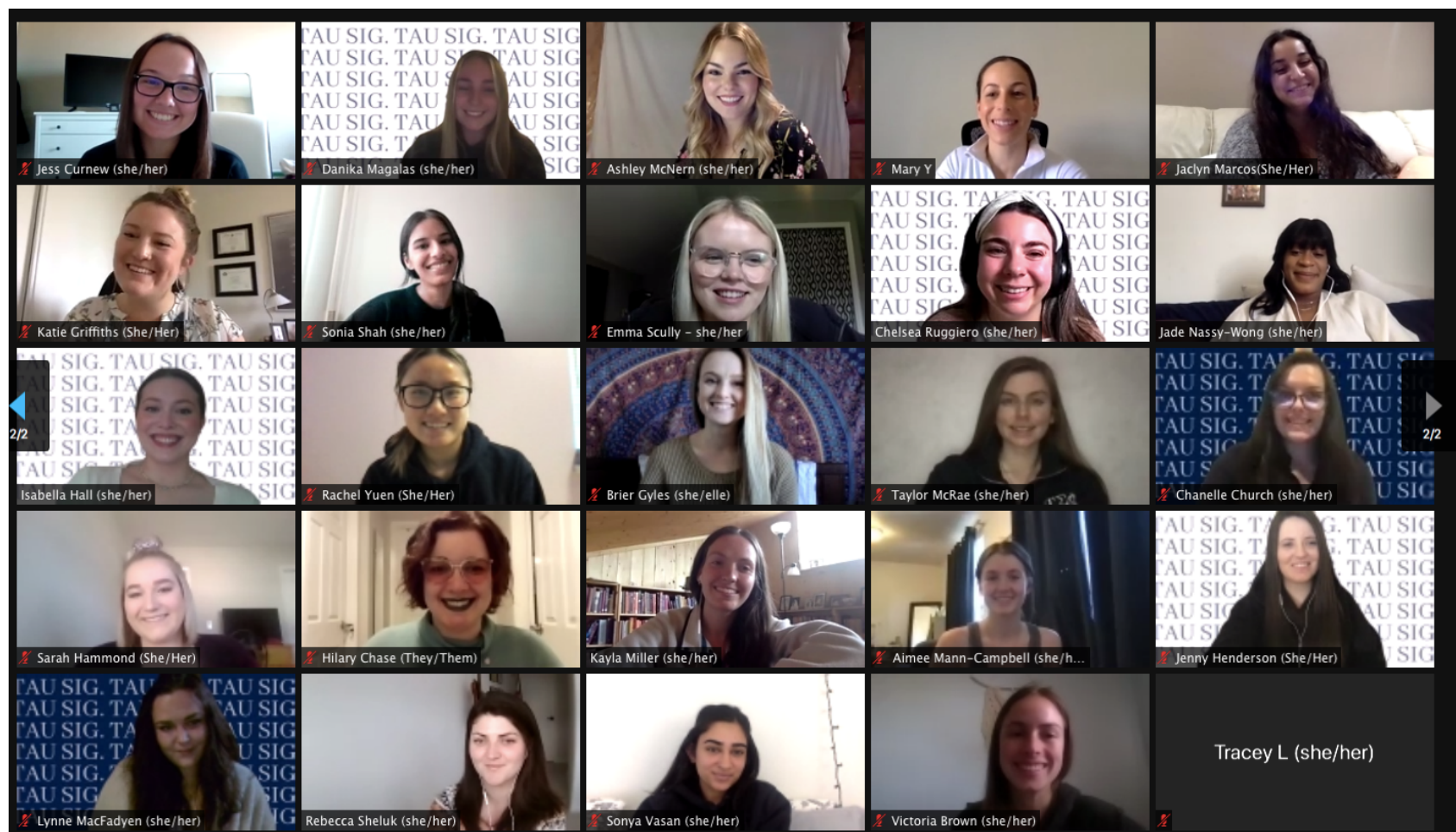
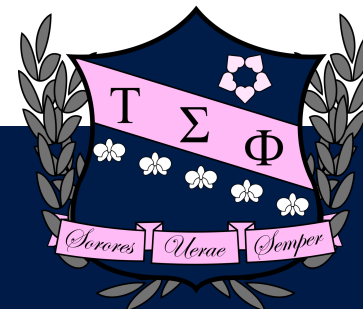

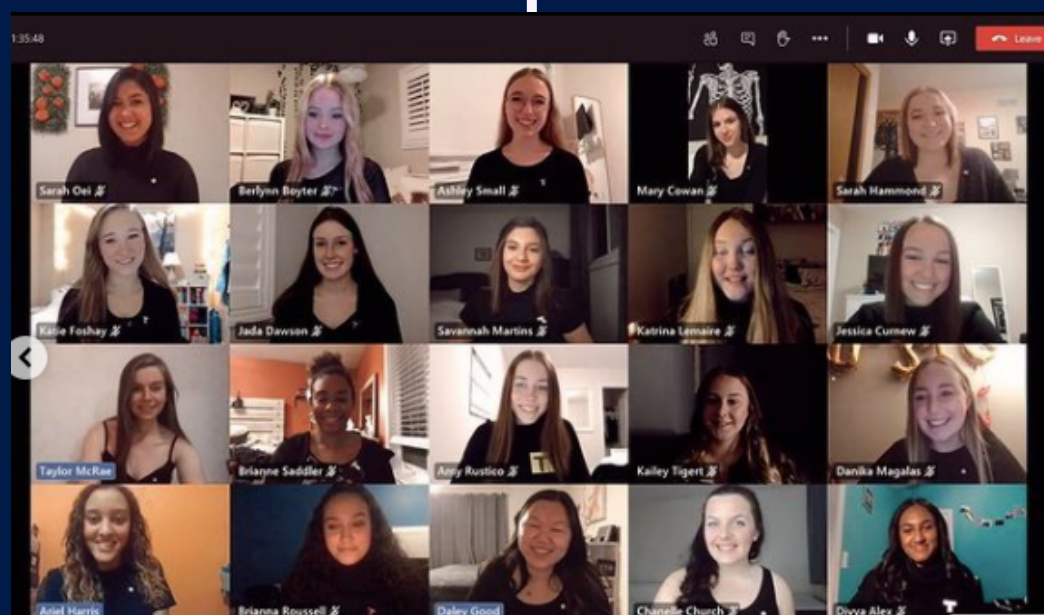
2021 Recipient: Alpha Chapter

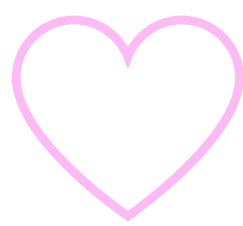

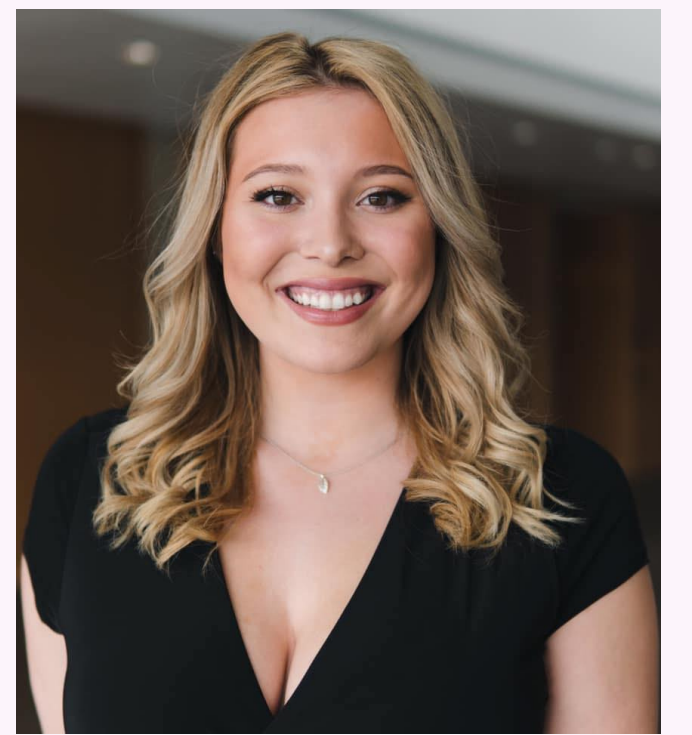

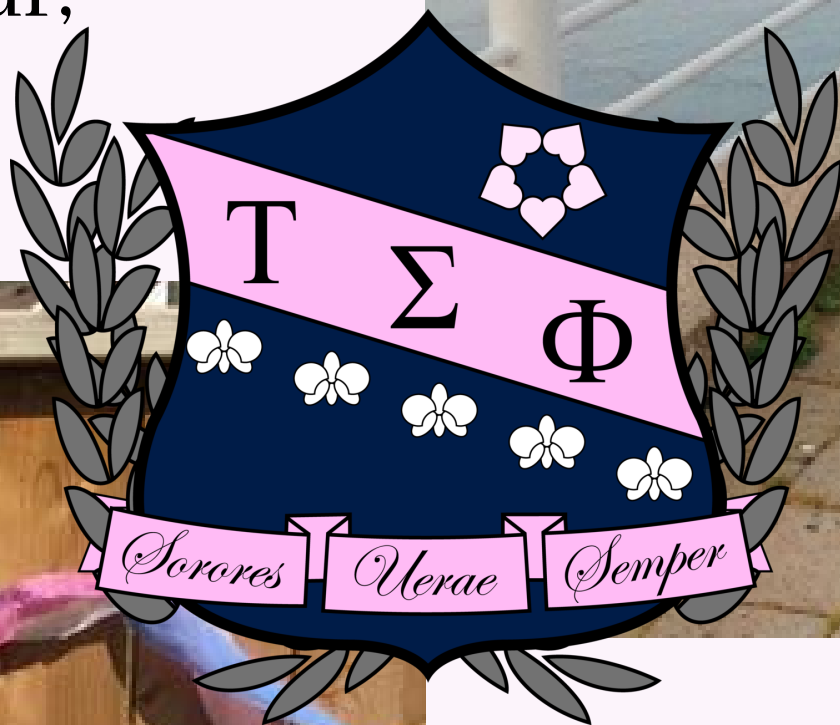
